### **APRIL TAYLOR TO HEADLINE CHARITY EVENT IN SUPPORT OF NEW HORIZONS**

**NASHVILLE, Tenn. (April 18, 2006)** - On Saturday May 13, 2006, Plateau Music recording artist April Taylor will join a host of local artists to headline a show to benefit New Horizons. The show will take place at Nashville Shores on the banks of Percy Priest Lake following the first annual *Charity Bike and Poker Ride*.

Motorcyclists will begin the poker run at 9 am on May 13<sup>th</sup> at any of four sponsor locations; *HDP Motorcycles* (Mt. Juliet), *Bumpus Harley Davidson* (Murfreesboro), *Coaches Sports Bar* (Rivergate), *Harley Davidson of Cool Springs* (Franklin), or at the New Horizons office. Riders will then travel to each of the five locations before continuing on to Nashville Shores for an entertainment-filled, family oriented event. Live music begins at 2 pm with Taylor and her band taking the stage at 5:30 pm to perform songs from debut CD *I Wanna Live Like That*. The second single from the project, "All My Love" was just released to radio and is already climbing the charts.

Prize drawings, a silent auction and other events will also be held at the concert site. Poker Run fees are \$15 per rider and \$10 per passenger. Registration is available at participating sponsor's locations and New Horizons. The event is open to all types of bikes.

In 1971, New Horizons became the first program of its kind in Middle Tennessee. Clients are trained according to individual skill levels and earn piece rate wages determined by time studies. A recent contract for Austin Foam resulted in clients assembling 120,000 units per week! Clients of New Horizons take great pride in their work, which gives them a focus and sense of accomplishment in their daily lives. These individuals enjoy not only their training and work, but also the friends they make with other clients and staff members. In addition to the production center, NHC service recipients travel in work teams for jobs in cleaning, landscaping and mechanical assembly.
